GUIDELINES

Eligibility

To be eligible for an Abramson Scholarship, you must:

- Be graduating in June 2017 from a public high school located in the District of Columbia (D.C.)
- Be a D.C. Resident
- Have admission to and commitment to attend an accredited four-year college in the United States as a candidate for a degree
- Have a demonstrated commitment to community service
- Have an economic need for financial assistance and a family income of less than \$70,000
- Have a solid academic record demonstrated by an overall 2.75 GPA or better, at least 1000 combined SAT scores among evidence-based reading plus writing and math, and a combined score of 12 or above if you've taken the optional SAT essay.

- Two letters of recommendation (one from a counselor, one from a teacher)
- Proof of income the first page of the most recent IRS 1040 form of the parent(s) or guardian(s) with whom you live and/or who financially support you and a copy of your Financial Aid Application or Student Aid Report
- Official high school transcript through midterm period of second semester senior year
- Official copy of SAT scores
- Budget for preferred college: full cost of attending college, room and board, travel, books, miscellaneous
- List of other scholarships received or pending
- Letter of acceptance from college of choice
- Financial aid award letter from college of choice (if available by Abramson Scholarship application due date)

Awardee Information

If selected as an Abramson Scholar, in order to receive your scholarship award payments, you must:

- Attend the Abramson Scholarship Foundation event in your honor to be held in June 2017
- Attend the Abramson Scholarship Foundation Scholar-Mentor Orientation Workshop to be held in Summer 2017
- Attend the Abramson Scholarship Foundation Professional Development Workshop during your college winter break
- Maintain regular and consistent contact with the Abramson Scholarship Foundation through your mentor, the Mentoring Chair, and/or other representatives of the Foundation
- Provide the Abramson Scholarship Foundation with a transcript/grade report after each semester of college

In order to receive continuing awards, an awardee must apply each year and provide proof of academic achievement, financial need, and demonstrate continued participation in the Abramson Scholarship Foundation program.

Deadline (Postmark Deadline)

Friday, April 28, 2017

Award Amount

\$2000 (with the possibility of increasing awards of \$3000, \$4000, and \$5000 for each subsequent year in the remaining three years of college)

Review Process: The Foundation's Board of Directors will review applications and a limited number of applicants will be invited to interview with members of the Board. Scholarship awards will be determined and applicants will be notified by early June 2017.

Frederick B. Abramson was a distinguished member of the Washington D.C. legal community. He grew up in Harlem, earned a scholarship to a private high school and to Yale University, and graduated from the University of Chicago Law School.

Fred was enormously successful professionally, but he never forgot his roots or how crucial education was to his success. During his life, he was a mentor and role model to many – particularly women and people of color pursuing their educational and professional goals.

In 1991, Fred passed away and several of his friends and colleagues formed the Frederick B. Abramson Memorial Foundation, now the Abramson Scholarship Foundation, in his memory. Their goal was to continue Fred's work by supporting young men and women who are active in their communities as they pursue higher education and their professional goals. The Foundation's mission is to give back to the community by investing in its human capital -- young people like you.
